NOTICE OF APPEAL

This is notice that the Appellants appeal the order of the Supreme Court of Newfoundland and Labrador.

(2) Subject matter of the appeal:

This is an appeal from the order of Justice Burrage which upheld the constitutionality of s. 28(1)(h) of the *Public Health Protection and Promotion Act* (the *PHPPA*) and the Special Measures Order (Amendment No. 11) issued by the Chief Medical Officer of Health on 29 April 2020 (the "impugned measures"). The order also held the challenge to the constitutionality of s. 28.1 of s. 50(1) of the *PPHPA* was non-justiciable on the record before the court, and that the Second Respondent did not have standing to bring that portion of the claim.



The Appellants challenged the impugned provisions on federalism grounds, and on the basis that they violated sections 6 and 7 of the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms and were not a reasonable limit pursuant to section 1.

Justice Burrage found a violation of section 6 of the *Charter* but held that it was justified pursuant to section 1. The section 7 claim was dismissed, as was the claim that s. 28(1)(h) of the *PHPPA* was beyond the jurisdiction of the provincial government.

- (3) The Appellant requests that the Order of Burrage J. be set aside and that this Court declare the impugned provisions to be of no force or effect.
- (4) The Court and parties are advised:
 - (d) The constitutionality or legality of the following provision of an Act, regulation or rule will be challenged in the appeal: section 28(1) and section 50 of the *PHPPA*, and the Special Measures Order (Amendment No. 11) issued by the Chief Medical Officer of Health on 29 April 2020.
